

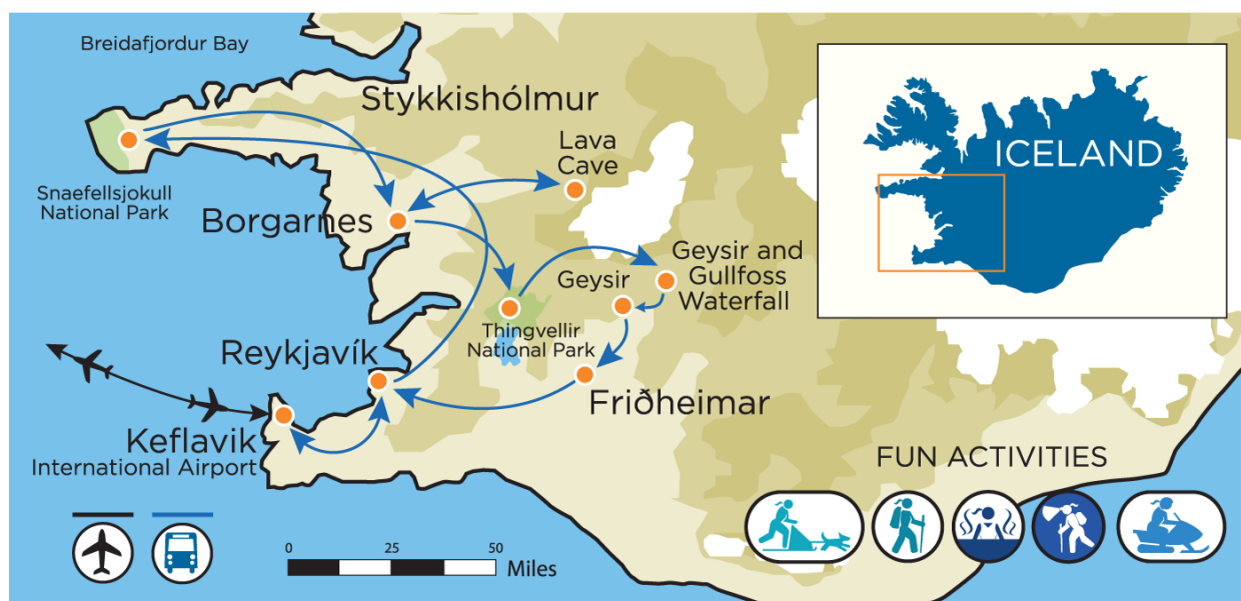

### Arrive Reykjavik, Iceland

Visit Iceland for crisp winter nights and a rare opportunity to search for the northern lights. If atmospheric conditions are right, the Aurora Borealis will roar into your view with a mesmerizing show: rippling ribbons of light radiate in neon green, red, and gold; the intensity of northern lights displays in Iceland will leave you awe-struck and always produces extraordinary night photography. Get to know your expert Icelandic guide, who will help you learn about local traditions and foods, as well as guide you as you drive a snowmobile, and search for the northern lights. You'll meet other incredible individuals on your journey. They will help make your experience a fun and personally fulfilling adventure and will cheer you on as you reach beyond your comfort zone and embrace new challenges!

#### Arrival Information

Arrive at Keflavik International Airport (KEF) today by 7:00am.

#### Pick-up and Transfer

You'll be met by a driver at the Reykjavik airport early this morning to start your adventure! If you are arriving into Reykjavik before the official start of the trip, meet your guide at 10am in the lobby of your Hotel.

#### Explore Reykjavik

As soon as it gets a little bit lighter out, set off on a tour of Reykjavik on foot and by bus. Discover this small but charming Nordic capital, including its historic buildings, the main shopping streets, a sculpture garden, the Opera House, and the mighty Hallgrímskirkja Church which towers over the city center.

#### Perlan

After lunch at a local bistro, head to Perlan, a huge glass dome on top of a hill. You'll experience the ice cave, which is 100 meters long and made from 350+ tons of mountain ice, snow, and volcano ash. As you exit the ice cave, you enter a modern, interactive exhibition about glaciers where you will see, hear and feel the power of our earth, volcanoes, earthquakes, and geothermal energy come alive at your fingertips.

#### Dinner

Enjoy a festive welcome dinner with the group tonight as you get to know your fellow AdventureWomen travelers.

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**DAY 2**

### Reykjavík to West Iceland

Stretching from soaring peaks on its eastern boundary to the ghost-haunted shores of the Atlantic in the west, Snæfellsjökull National Park is a microcosm of Iceland's bewitching geography. Its crowning glory, Snæfellsjökull Glacier, rises 4,800 feet above sea level; its underlying volcano has been dormant for nearly 1,800 years.

#### Snæfellsjökull National Park

Head out of Reykjavík via the under-sea tunnel and spend most of your day exploring in Snæfellsjökull National Park, enjoying stunning views all along the way. Declared a National Park in 2001, the area has an astonishing variety of natural landscapes, including moss-covered lava fields, pebbled beaches, and rugged cliffs. Explore with the other women on your trip on foot for different vantage points in this amazing natural setting.

#### Lunch on Your Own

Enjoy lunch on your own today.

#### Evening Activities

Enjoy a soak in the geothermal pool before dinner. Spend some time outside this evening looking for the Northern Lights - you're in the perfect location to see them here, as there is very little light pollution.

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**DAY 3**

### West Iceland

Enjoy a full day exploring the stunning and dramatic landscapes of Iceland. The contrasts seem to be made for beautiful photographs.

#### Explore a Cave

Equipped with safety gear and led by a guide, you'll head into one of Iceland's largest lava caves in the Hallmundarhraun lava field. Experience the magnificent underground lava and, at some point, experience total and complete darkness.

#### Visit a Goat Farm

Stop for a visit at the Icelandic goat farm owned by Johanna Bermann. In the year 2000, Johanna secured the last four hornless goats in Iceland, then on the brink of extinction, and bred them back to a sustainable population. She established the Icelandic Goat Conservation Center, and there are now over 800 Icelandic goats in the country. You may have the chance to come face to face with Bambi, the famous goat from Game of Thrones! After your visit, enjoy lunch on your own at a local restaurant.

#### Waterfalls and Hot Springs

Back up on the surface, visit the Hraunfossar lava waterfalls and Deildartunguhver, the largest natural hot spring in Europe. Drawing on the geothermal reserves in the area, it pumps out a staggering 180 liters of boiling water each second, and the billowing clouds of steam created by this mighty fissure are truly impressive.

Next to the hot spring is the Krauma Spa, where you can enjoy a sauna, various hot tubs, and the relaxation room with a crackling fireplace. Krauma has a total of six baths, five warm and one cold. No extra chemicals are needed to keep the pools clean, as the water is constantly being replaced because of the rapid natural flow rate of the hot springs.

### West Iceland to Geysir

Geysir is one of the highlights of Iceland's Golden Circle and lies in one of the most active geothermal areas in the country.

#### Morning Dogsledding

One of the highlights of your week is sure to be today's 45-minute dogsledding excursion. Feel the power, excitement, and energy of these amazing sled dogs as they are harnessed to go. During the ride, your Musher guide will drive your team while sharing his knowledge and passion about dogsledding. Halfway through, you'll stop for a quick photo break where you can cuddle with the dogs. Belly rubs are mandatory!

#### Thingvellir National Park

Your next destination is historic Thingvellir National Park. You will see the spectacular natural amphitheater, where almost every important moment in Iceland's history has taken place. Today, Thingvellir is still regarded with reverence by Icelanders, its historical weight reinforced by a serene natural beauty. Thingvellir sits right on top of the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, and you can clearly see the dividing plates and the lake-filled-valley that has developed between the plates. Afterwards, enjoy lunch on your own.

#### Great Geysir Hot Spring and Gullfoss

Continue to the Great Geysir hot spring area and Gullfoss Waterfall (the Golden Waterfall), two of Iceland's most famous sights. Although the Great Geysir itself has been inactive since the 1960s, Storokkur, fires off a 30-meter-high spout every few minutes.

#### Secret Lagoon

On your way to your hotel, stop for a soak in the natural hot springs of the Secret Lagoon. The pool's steam rising into the air gives it a magical feeling, and the temperature of the hot springs water stays at 100-104 degrees Fahrenheit all year round. Changing rooms with showers are on site.

#### Dinner

### Geysir

Enjoy another spectacular day in the area of Geysir trying new activities and immersing yourself in surreal Icelandic landscapes with your new friends.

#### Waterfalls of the South

Set out to discover the waterfalls of Iceland's South Shore. If the weather is good, you might be able to walk behind Seljalandsfoss waterfall and up the stairs to admire Skógarfoss waterfall from above, complete with stunning ocean views!

#### Snowmobile Experience

Board a super truck and head to the top of Mýrdalsjökull glacier, an icecap covering one of Iceland's largest volcanoes, Katla. Put on your gear and learn how to operate your snowmobile. Drive off up the mountain towards the amazing glacial landscape before you head off to explore. Two women will be on each snowmobile, and there will be a chance to switch drivers halfway through. You will need a valid driver's license to drive the snowmobile.

#### Picnic Lunch on Own

Today you will pick up some food on your own to create a picnic lunch to enjoy during the snowmobiling experience.

#### Black Beach

Enjoy an exploratory walk along the Black Beach with your guide.

#### Dinner

After enjoying dinner with the group, look up at the night sky outside of your hotel to see if you can catch a glimpse of the Northern Lights!

### Geysir to Reykjavik

Head from Geysir back to Reykjavík today.

#### Farm Visit and Lunch

Head to Friðheimar, a charming farm where tomatoes are grown in geothermally heated greenhouses. The farm also breeds and raises prize winning Icelandic horses which you will see during a visit to the stables. Enjoy lunch at the cozy Greenhouse restaurant.

#### Sky Lagoon

After arriving in Reykjavík, spend some time at the brand-new Sky Lagoon for a soak in the warm, mineral-rich waters of this surreal outdoor spa. Just opened in 2021, this new oceanfront geothermal lagoon is a great way to relax after a busy day.

#### Farewell Dinner

Enjoy a celebratory farewell dinner with your new friends to celebrate the end of a fantastic adventure!

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### Accommodation Details

#### Hotel Reykjavik Saga

Hotel Reykjavik Saga is an elegant 4-star hotel that opened in July 2022. Ideally situated at the very heart of the Reykjavik city center, the hotel is a stone's throw away from picturesque Lake Tjörnin, the cathedral, art museum, shops and restaurants. The hotel is on Lækjargata, a historic street in the center of Reykjavik and has been designed in a modern style that reflects Icelandic tradition. Location and environment have been fully considered throughout the design process.

Amenities: En suite bathrooms with soap, shampoo, conditioner, hair dryer, flatscreen TV, coffee / tea maker, electricity (outlet type C or F); blackout curtains, Wifi

#### Hotel Hamar

Located about an hour outside of Reykjavik, Icelandair Hotel Hamar is a relaxing accommodation built on an 18-hole golf course. Enjoy the natural beauty and green views from your room or have a soak in one of the geothermal-heated outdoor hot tubs.

#### Hotel Geysir

Hotel Geysir is located right in front of Iceland's trademark Great Geysir. Surrounded by an area rich with geothermal activity, this hotel will provide a great vantage point for all the beauty that Icelandic nature has to offer.

Amenities: En suite bathrooms with soap, shampoo, conditioner, hair dryer; electricity (outlet type C or F); Wifi

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### Cancellations and Refunds

Notification of cancellation must be made in writing to AdventureWomen, LLC (email will be accepted). Full payment is due 90 days prior to departure date.

- For cancellations received 89-60 days prior to the trip departure date: 50% of the package price is non-refundable and non-transferable.

- For cancellations received 59-0 days prior to the trip departure date: 100% of the package price is non-refundable and non-transferable.

You are highly encouraged to purchase **trip cancellation insurance** to cover emergency situations. Travel insurance information will be sent to you once you have registered for your trip.

### Deposit Transfer

You can transfer your deposit to another trip with no additional fee if you notify us within 120 days of the original trip departure date. We can hold your deposit for up to six months as a credit. Failure to book a new trip within this timeframe will result in the forfeiture of your deposit. Please note that this policy doesn't apply to extensions purchased with the main trip, for which the deposit is non-refundable and non-transferable. Please note that the deposit for extensions is non-refundable and non-transferable.

### No Smoking Policy

Beginning in 1995, our trips became smoke free. Please note that there will be no smoking by any participants on AdventureWomen trips.

### Health Insurance

You must have your own health insurance to participate in an AdventureWomen trip.

### Adventure Travel Today
