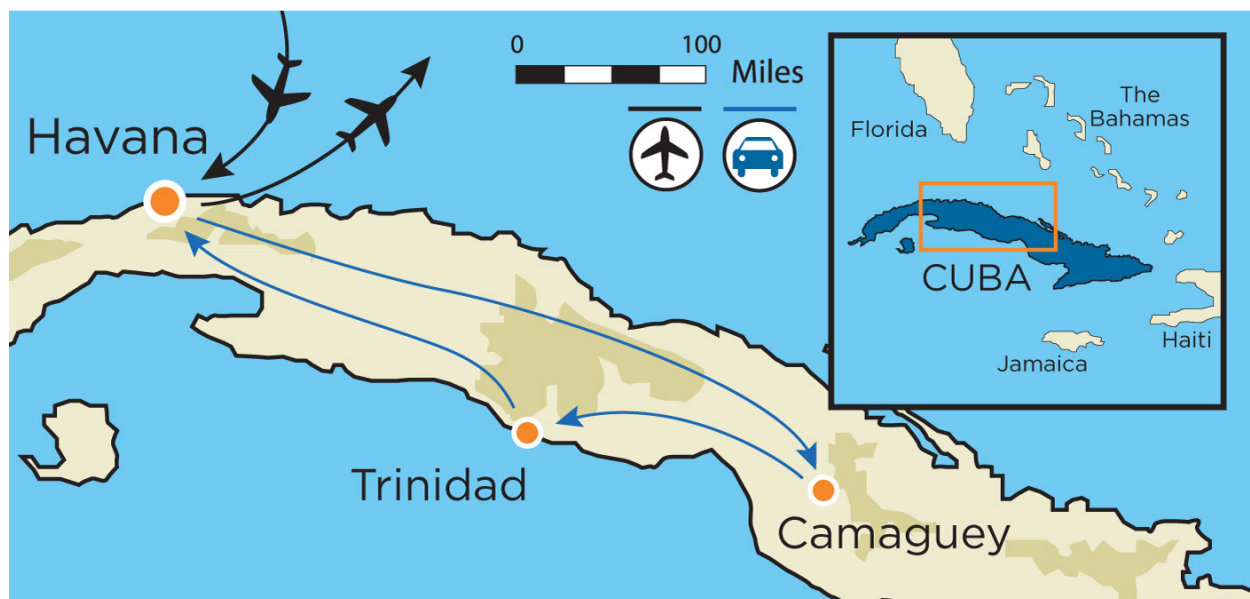

DAY 1
Thursday
3/14/24

Arrive in Havana

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DAY 2
Friday

Havana to Camagüey

Camagüey, Cuba's third-largest city, was one of the seven original settlements founded in Cuba by the Spanish and was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2008. Camagüey offers a delightful "get lost" adventure through its zigzagging warren of streets.

Drive to Santa Clara

Leave Havana early this morning and drive to Santa Clara, about three hours away.

Che Guevara Mausoleum

Visit the Che Guevara Mausoleum in Santa Clara. This location was chosen in remembrance of Guevara's troops taking the city on December 31, 1958 in the Battle of Santa Clara. This was the last battle of the Cuban Revolution and caused Cuban dictator Fulgencio Batista to flee into exile.

Explore Santa Clara

Go on a walking tour of Santa Clara with a local guide, learning the history of the city. Visit one of your guide's favorite paladares for lunch.

Drive to Camagüey

Continue your drive east to Camagüey, arriving in the early evening.

Dinner and Nightlife

Head out for dinner as a group this evening. It's Friday night, so there is likely live entertainment. Your guide will suggest the best spots in the area for music and dancing.

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DAY 3
Saturday
3/16/24

Camagüey

The symbol of the city of Camagüey is the clay pot, or tinajón, used to capture rainwater to be used later, keeping it fresh. Clay pots are everywhere, some as small as a hand, some large enough for two people to stand up in, either as monuments or for real use.

Explore Camagüey

Head out on a walking tour of Camagüey this morning. Most Spanish colonial cities have streets that were laid out on a grid. Camagüey's streets, however, are wonderfully abstract, with tangled alleyways leading to small plazas all over the city. Exploring the back streets outside of the popular squares will reveal endless surprises.

Morning Activities

Visit a local artist's gallery to begin your discovery of the diverse Cuban art scene. After the gallery, learn to move like a local: take a professionally led salsa class. Don't worry, there's no judgment! Just have fun!

Lunch

Enjoy lunch at a nearby paladar after your active morning.

Pottery Workshop

Try your hand at making your own Camagüey clay pot at a pottery workshop this afternoon.

Afternoon at Leisure

There's ample time this afternoon to relax, refresh, and explore the plazas near your accommodations.

Evening Plans

Head out with your group for a late dinner. After dinner, explore the local nightlife! Visit Camagüey's Casa de la Trova for music and dancing (subject to local schedule; entrance fee included, beverages on your own)

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DAY 4
Sunday
3/17/24

Camagüey to Trinidad

Continue to colorful Trinidad, hailed as Cuba's most photogenic town. Trinidad is one of the best-preserved cities in the Caribbean from the time when the sugar trade was the main industry in the region.

Drive to Trinidad

Leave Camagüey's charming streets and drive to Trinidad. The drive will take about four hours.

Lunch

When you arrive, enjoy lunch at a paladar that offers both continental and local cuisine.

Tour Trinidad

Take time this afternoon to stretch your legs on a walking tour of this captivating town. Trinidad served as the center of the world's sugar production during the Spanish conquest of the Caribbean and Central America.

Meet a Local Artist

Have a coffee with a local female artist at her studio. Spend some time getting to know her and what life is like as an artist in Cuba.

Afternoon and Evening

Settle in and relax at your bed and breakfast. Take some time to explore Trinidad on your own this afternoon. Dinner reservations will be made at a paladar in the town center; dinner is on your own this evening.

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DAY 5
Monday

Trinidad

Trinidad is a UNESCO World Heritage Site because of its beautifully preserved colonial cobblestoned streets and pastel-lined alleyways. Trinidad is also home to Topes de Collantes National Park, a beautiful natural area in the Escambray Mountains.

Visit a Local Coffee Grower

Coffee from Topes is not well-known but fetches more than \$25 a pound internationally. Visit a local coffee grower and learn about his life in Cuba. Sample his delicious coffee before you leave!

Hike in Topes de Collantes

Topes is known for the numerous bird species, scenic hikes, and stunning waterfalls that canvas the national park. Head out for a morning hike through the tropical forest to one of the region's waterfalls. The hike will be moderately difficult, down to the waterfall with an uphill hike on the return. Bring along a swimsuit if you'd like to take a dip in the pool below the falls.

Lunch

Enjoy a traditional Cuban lunch at a rustic paladar in the National Park.

Afternoon to Explore

Take the afternoon to explore Trinidad on your own, or just kick your feet up and relax after your morning hike.

Dinner

Head out for a sunset cocktail on a rooftop, and then enjoy dinner with your group in a paladar.

Optional Evening on the Town

For those who are interested, your guide will escort you to Trinidad's outdoor entertainment venue, Casa de La Musica. Entrance fees and drinks are on your own.

Trinidad to Havana

Havana, the leading cultural center of Cuba, boasts museums, palaces, public squares, avenues, churches, fortresses, art, and music.

Kayak in Cienfuegos Bay

Start your morning with a rare glimpse of Cuba's stunning coastline. You'll encounter flamingos and other bird species during a kayaking trip along Cienfuegos Bay - seeing them in their natural environment is an absolute treat. Double and single kayaks are available.

Lunch

Have lunch in Cienfuegos today at a paladar offering stunning views of the bay and the Escambray Mountains in the distance.

Explore Cienfuegos

Cienfuegos is the only city in Cuba that was founded by the French, which becomes immediately apparent with the French-colonial architecture. Explore the city center on foot with your guide.

Check-in and Dinner

Check in at your B&B in Havana after a long day of travel. Dinner at your B&B is included tonight; feel free to eat at your leisure as dinner is served until 9:00pm.

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DAY 7
Wednesday

Havana

Havana turned 500 years old in 2019. It is one of this hemisphere's greatest treasures from the colonial expansion of Spain. Old Havana is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, dating back to 1519. It features a mix of Baroque and neoclassical architecture, balconies with wrought-iron gates, and Spanish courtyards in a beautiful tropical setting.

Explore Old Havana

Walk the streets of La Habana Vieja with your guide as they come to life. Explore the four main plazas and learn about the history, culture, architecture, and romance that have endeared the old town to so many cultures over the centuries. Stop to visit a few female cuentapropistas (private business owners) who specialize in fashion design.

Lunch

Enjoy tapas and lighter fare at a paladar owned by a female cuentapropista who studied to be a physicist before deciding to become a restaurateur.

Time on Your Own

Take some time to do some shopping in Old Havana after lunch or simply explore the beautiful streets.

Classic Car Business

Visit a business founded by one of Cuba's most influential female cuentapropistas. Nidialis, and her husband Jorge, have created a business focused on impeccably restoring classic cars. Their list of VIP visitors they've hosted includes the likes of Beyoncé and Jon Bon Jovi. Learn how old American cars are restored to their full glory in their "magic" garage.

Tour Havana by Classic Car

Explore Cuba's capital by classic car, cruising through the diverse neighborhoods of the city and seeing the landmarks that are not to be missed when exploring Havana. Your stylish ride ends at the iconic 1930 Hotel Nacional, made famous during the time of gangsters and crooners. Tour the grand lobby and Hall of History and sip a refreshing cocktail in their gardens overlooking Havana's seaside avenue, the Malecon, at sunset.

Dinner this evening is a special treat. A number of local Cubans will join you at an intimate setting to share more about life on the island and learn more about you!

Havana

Morning of Art

Meet an art curator this morning who will host your exploration into Cuban art today. Bellas Artes, Havana's fine arts museum, is a uniquely curated collection of Cuban art. It is broken down by timeline, pre- and post-revolutionary. Your art curator will bring the story of Cuba's history to life through the museum's fascinating exhibits.

Fast forward to Havana's current art scene as you visit a contemporary studio. Meet the artist and learn more about the new challenges facing Cuban artists under Cuba's current government.

Lunch

Enjoy lunch at a local paladar.

Afternoon Activities

There's a bit of time this afternoon to visit Cuba's largest arts and crafts market, Almacenes de San Jose. Next, a local dance company will host you for a tour of their studio and a short performance.

Cocktail Lesson

Before dinner tonight, you will learn to make Cuba's signature cocktails during a visit to a local bar for a cocktail lesson with a professional Cuban mixologist. Non-alcoholic cocktails will be available as well.

Dinner on Your Own

Dinner reservations have been made for you this evening at small tables in a paladar located inside of the famed Fabrica de Arte Cubano. The menu features dishes from all over the Latin world. Dinner is on your own.

Havana Nightlife

Following dinner, it's time to explore the amazing amalgamation of art, music, dancing, at the local meeting place known as Fabrica de Arte Cubano. Your guide and drivers are available until midnight this evening for your convenience.

Havana

Cuban cuisine is a blend of Spanish, African, and other Caribbean cuisines. A typical meal consists of rice and beans. When they are cooked together it is called "conгри" or "Moros", and when they are cooked separately it is called "arroz con frijoles." Taste amazing meals at local paladares.

Visit the Fishing Village of Cojímar

Approximately 20 minutes east of Havana lies the fishing village that served as the backdrop for Ernest Hemingway's *The Old Man and The Sea*. See the town which inspired his fishing spirit and the bust that was sculpted from funds raised by local residents who, to this day, remember and speak fondly of Papa Hemingway.

Cooking Lesson and Lunch

After a quick tour, you visit an organopónico (urban garden) that grows vegetables for the paladar where you are having a cooking lesson and lunch today. Besides learning a special recipe for mojito, you will also learn how to cook a traditional Cuban stew: ajíaco!

Afternoon on Your Own

There's time this afternoon to relax or head out to find some last-minute souvenirs.

Farewell Dinner

Head out for a farewell dinner at what many would argue is Cuba's finest paladar. Dinner is at 7:00pm to ensure there's ample time to take in a show or enjoy Havana's entertainment before your departure tomorrow. Guide and drivers are available until midnight for your convenience. Entrance fees and drinks are on your own.

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Cancellations and Refunds

Notification of cancellations must be received in writing. Full payment is due 90 days prior to departure date, and the registration deposit is non-refundable.

For cancellations received 61-90 days prior to the trip departure date: 50% of the total trip cost is non-refundable. For cancellations received 1-60 days prior to the trip departure date: 100% of the total trip cost is non-refundable.

You are highly encouraged to purchase trip cancellation insurance to cover emergency situations. Travel insurance information will be sent to you once you have registered for your trip.

Switching Trips

Our deposits are nonrefundable and nontransferable. If for some reason you need to switch to a different trip, please call us and we will do our best to accommodate you, but switching is not guaranteed.
