Enjoy a day of whale watching from boats that sit low in the water to provide an up-close look at these very gentle giants. Return to Todos Santos for a final sunset and exquisite group dinner where you and your new friends can reflect on this amazing trip.


# Trip Highlights

#### Day 1

### Welcome to Baja!

Your guide will meet you at the San Jose del Cabo airport. Bordered by both the wild Pacific Ocean and the protected Sea of Cortez, Baja is a haven for exotic plants, birds, and animals (both terrestrial and marine) and is home to friendly and welcoming people. Over the next eight days, you'll learn about the area's traditions, foods, and wildlife. Please note: The Cabo airport is very busy, but AdventureWomen will make sure you know where you're going! You'll receive instructions on the exact meeting location about a month prior to your trip. Once you are settled in, you'll enjoy a delicious welcome dinner with your fellow travelers to kick off your trip.

### Los Colibris Casitas

Los Colibris – The Hummingbirds – is in Todos Santos, just a ten-minute walk from the area's beautiful beaches. The property features two big casas (houses), two casitas (little houses), and 5 suites. Each building and room isare configured and decorated in a unique way. The accommodations all include a balcony, porch or patio, lovely views of the Pacific Ocean and Iagoon, a small refrigerator, and a ceiling fan. The property has a water filtration system, so you can safely drink from the water from the tap.

#### Day 2

### Kayaking or Paddle boarding on Isla Espiritu Santo

Start with a terrific Mexican breakfast prepared by a local chef. Begin your tortilla-making lesson right after breakfast to ensure plenty of tortillas for your cooking class tonight. Take a surfing lesson today. No experience? No problem! Your instructors guarantee that you will stand up – at least for a moment – during your first lesson. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant with a female chef, entrepreneur, and artist's daughter. End the day with a Mexican cooking class, starting with the perfect margarita. Pay attention as you learn from the chef – you are making your own dinner!

Day 3

### Beach Camp Adventure

Drive to La Paz, stopping to try on your wet suit and get your snorkeling gear. From La Paz, board a boat for a 60-minute ride to your beach camp on Isla Espiritu Santo. Wear your bathing suit this morning, just in case there is a chance to swim along the way. Spend your afternoon kayaking or stand-up paddleboarding, exploring hidden lagoons and desert beaches. Enjoy sunset happy hour with your group as you sip a cold drink and sit with your toes in the sand. This is a perfect time to relax and soak in the beauty of your surroundings.

### **Baja-Style Beach Camping**

You will love your base camp on one of the Isla Espiritu Santo's most beautiful beaches! It features tents with real mattresses, lovely linens, and pillows. There is a kitchen tent where your on-site chef makes wonderful meals for you every day, and there are sun showers and portable toilets in separate cabanas.

Amenities: Composting toilet cabanas (not en suite), sun shower cabanas with soap and shampoo, solar charging station for small devices, campsite is off grid





#### Day 4

### Swim with Sea Lions

Explore Espiritu Santo National Park, part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The park is one of the best marine life viewing destinations in the world, home to whales, dolphins, sea turtles, manta rays, and tropical fish. Bird species like Blue-footed Boobies and Great Blue Herons frequent the island. The island itself features towering cliffs, sandy bays, lava rock formations, and ancient rock art. Swimming with sea lions is magical, with unforgettable nose-to-nose encounters. Grab some snorkeling gear and jump in with them. Enjoy a dinner from the camp kitchen and a relaxing night on the beach.

#### Day 5

### Journey to Magdalena Bay

Head out onto the water for a morning of unforgettable encounters with gray whales. Travel through the peaceful waters of Magdalena Bay in motorized skiffs, the perfect vantage point for a "whale's-eye view" of these gentle giants. Afterward, enjoy lunch and a guided nature walk through the surrounding landscape. In the afternoon, return to the bay for another whale-watching adventure. While wildlife is never predictable, past guests have witnessed mother whales lifting their calves to the surface, males spouting water onto the boats, and curious gray whales rising from the depths to meet your gaze.

### Camp Cecil de la Bahia

Camp Cecil de la Bahia is located on a sliver of land with the Bay and the gray whales on one side, and a protected estuary with mangroves, abundant birdlife, dolphins and more on the other. Each year the gray whales migrate 6,000 miles from arctic waters to the Pacific lagoons of the Baja peninsula to mate, give birth, and enjoy a warm winter respite. Magdalena Bay is one of the most important of these lagoons, and Camp Cecil de la Bahia is one of the best whale watching spots in all of Baja. Whales are simply everywhere! The camp chef prepares three beautiful meals a day and daily happy hour. There are two sunshower cabanas at the camp. It is a dreamy, wild and remote spot, completely ensconced in nature, enhanced by delights of great food and comfortable lodging.





#### Day 6

### Whale Encounters

Head out onto the water for a morning of interacting with whales. Highly experienced staff will ferry you through the waters of Magdalena Bay to whale watch from motorized skiffs, perfect conveyances from which to have a "whale's eye view" of the great grays. Enjoy lunch and a nature walk after your morning on the water, then head out for another afternoon of whale watching. It is impossible to predict anything with wildlife, but in the past, AdventureWomen guests have seen mother whales bringing their babies up to the boat to say hello and males sidling up and spouting water.

#### Day 7

### Farewell to Whales

Enjoy another couple of hours of whale watching, spending a little bit more time with these majestic, gentle creatures. Drive about five hours back from Magdalena Bay to Todos Santos. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant along the way. Start your farewell dinner with a mezcal tasting. Reminisce over all of the memories you have made and celebrate the end of an incredible trip with your new AdventureWomen friends!

### Depart Todos Santo

Say goodbye to your new AdventureWomen friends as you transfer to the airport for your flights home. Reflect on the amazing experiences and memories you've made during your time in Baja.
