
Trip Overview

Join this unforgettable expedition for a truly immersive Arctic experience!

Day 1

Should you arrive early, immerse yourself in the plethora of museums, galleries, and restaurants, unwind at a traditional Finnish sauna, or meander through the dynamic Design District before settling in at your designated hotel, connected to the airport. Once checked in, you will receive information for the following day's flight, and then you can attend a pre-departure briefing to address any questions. Day 2

flying to Longyearbyen

Following breakfast at your hotel, board your flight to Longyearbyen, the largest settlement and administrative center of Svalbard, a Norwegian archipelago in the Arctic Ocean. Despite its remote location, it is a vibrant community with a population of around 2,000. The town serves as a hub for scientific research in fields like polar studies and climate research. Due to port logistics, boarding the vessel via Zodiac may be necessary instead of from the pier. There is NO option to pay for additional luggage and there is a strict weight limit on baggage. As your ship embarks on its journey, admire the breathtaking sight of the island's rugged, glacier-capped mountains emerging majestically from the icy waters.

The Ocean Explorer is tailored for polar exploration. At the forefront of the ship lies a bright two-story library. Cabins exude a contemporary Scandinavian flair, offering spaciousness and thoughtful design. Guests can unwind in the spacious gym, enjoy the sauna, and indulge in relaxation with two outdoor Jacuzzis. Ocean Explorer is designed to maximize outdoor viewing opportunities, with multi-level decks ideal for capturing stunning long-range photography and observing wildlife. With a fleet of 15 Zodiacs onboard, guests can quickly and safely disembark for off-ship adventures.

Day 3

Exploring Spitsbergen

Sail through the captivating landscapes of Spitsbergen, the largest island in the Svalbard archipelago. Renowned for its stunning glaciers, fjords, and rugged mountains, this Arctic gem is rich in exploration history. Enjoy time on deck watching for wildlife, or dive into activities like Zodiac cruising, varied hiking, and expert-led talks. Capture the polar beauty with guided photography sessions or take a thrilling polar plunge! For the adventurous, optional sea kayaking and paddling excursions offer intimate explorations of this pristine environment. Remember, all activities require advance booking—secure your spot with your Trip Manager! Note: The itinerary provided each day is tentative and cannot be guaranteed. In remote regions, your Expedition Team must carefully consider sea, ice, and weather conditions when determining the route and itinerary details.



Day 4

The 14th of July Glacier

Today, a possible sight visit includes the 14th of July Glacier, known for its awe-inspiring polar landscape. The 14th of July Glacier also plays a crucial role in the Arctic ecosystem, serving as a habitat for various species of wildlife and contributing to the regulation of global climate patterns through its influence on sea levels and ocean currents. The Glacier offers Included activities range from expertled discussions, exhilarating Zodiac cruises, and photographic memories with optional opportunities to sea kayak and paddle. The area is known for its impressive glacier front with regular calvings that attract birds like Kittiwakes and thick-billed murres (Brünnich's guillemot) along with Atlantic Puffins.



Day 5

Smeerenburg, or "Blubber Town"

Have the opportunity to immerse yourself in the haunting beauty of Smeerenburg, or "Blubber Town," a former whaling hub from the 1600s and now a popular destination for historians, archaeologists, and tourists interested in exploring the history of Arctic exploration and the whaling industry. As you pass by desolate landscapes, discover the remnants of wooden structures and whale oil cauldrons that tell stories of Arctic hardship. Enjoy a breathtaking walrus haul-out, witnessing these massive creatures basking on the shores. Included activities range from expert-led discussions, exhilarating Zodiac cruises, and photographic memories with optional opportunities to sea kayak and paddle.



Day 6

Birdwatching and Thick Ice Passages

Explore the breathtaking Alkefjellet, a towering bird cliff teeming with hundreds of thousands of Brünnich's guillemots, known for upright forms reminiscent of penguins. This avian paradise captivates birdwatchers with its dramatic scenery. Then, pass through the challenging Hinlopen Strait, a waterway between Spitsbergen and Nordaustlandet, known for its thick pack ice. Here, wildlife thrives; keep an eye out for walrus colonies, seabirds, and elusive marine mammals like narwhals and polar bears. Included activities range from expert-led discussions, exhilarating Zodiac cruises, and photographic memories with optional opportunities to sea kayak and paddle.



Day 7

Passing through the Hinlopen Strait

Today, you will pass through the Hinlopen Strait. Despite its harsh conditions, the Arctic tundra is home to a variety of wildlife species. Iconic animals such as polar bears, Arctic foxes, caribou, muskoxen, and various species of migratory birds inhabit the tundra. These animals have specialized adaptations to survive in extreme conditions, including thick fur or feathers, insulation layers of fat, and seasonal migrations. The Arctic tundra is also known for its low-growing vegetation, including grasses, mosses, lichens, shrubs, and hardy flowering plants. Permafrost, a defining feature of the Arctic tundra, consists of soil, rock, and sediment that remains frozen year-round, with only the surface layer thawing during the summer months. Permafrost plays a crucial role in shaping the landscape and influencing plant growth, hydrology, and the stability of the terrain. Included activities range from expert-led discussions, exhilarating Zodiac cruises, and photographic memories with optional opportunities to sea kayak and paddle.



Day 8

Hornsund and its numerous glaciers

Hornsund is known for its numerous glaciers, which flow down from the surrounding mountains into the fjord. These glaciers are part of the larger ice cap covering much of Svalbard and contribute to the dynamic and ever-changing environment of the region. It is home to a diverse array of Arctic wildlife, including polar bears, Arctic foxes, Svalbard reindeer, and various species of seabirds. The nutrient-rich waters of the fjord support a rich ecosystem of marine life, including seals, whales, and seabirds. Enjoy opportunities for wildlife viewing, glacier exploration, hiking, and photography in one of the most remote and untouched regions of the world. Today's activities may include Zodiac cruising, hiking, daily polar experts chats and presentations, a polar plunge (scheduled only once per expedition), and photography opportunities (included). Additional options include Sea kayaking, paddling excursions (extra fees apply)



Day 9

Final Day Aboard the Ocean Explorer

During your final full day aboard the Ocean Explorer, seize the numerous chances for capturing wildlife through your lens. Witness polar bears set against breathtaking natural scenery of towering mountains and icy landscapes, amidst a constantly shifting display of magnificent icebergs. Enjoy a farewell dinner with your new AdventureWomen friends. Reflect on the cherished memories you've created and celebrate the conclusion of an amazing journey through this truly remarkable Arctic land. Today's activities may include Zodiac cruising, hiking, daily polar experts chats and presentations, a polar plunge (scheduled only once per expedition), and photography opportunities (included). Day 10

Farewell from Longyearbyen

After breakfast, say goodbye to your Expedition Team as your journey comes full circle in Longyearbyen. Disembarkation takes about an hour and may include one final Zodiac ride to the pier. Transfer to the airport for your charter flight back to Helsinki, with arrival details provided 30 days prior. If you wish to book international flights early, consider a post-night stay in Helsinki; our team can assist with arrangements. If traveling immediately, ensure a three-hour gap between your charter arrival and international departure. Taxis are available for transfers to the city
