Day 2

### Discover the Charm of Camagüey

Begin your day with a walking tour of Camagüey, navigating its abstract, tangled alleyways that reveal endless surprises beyond the popular squares. Visit a local artist's gallery to explore the vibrant Cuban art scene, then try your hand at pottery in a workshop, crafting your own Camagüey clay pot. Enjoy lunch at a nearby paladar before relaxing and exploring the plazas near your accommodations. Embrace Cuba's rhythm with a professionally led salsa class, then head out with your group for a late dinner and a night of music and dancing at Camagüey's Casa de la Trova.

#### Day 3

Spend the afternoon relaxing or shopping for souvenirs before heading to a farewell dinner at one of Cuba's finest paladars. You'll have time to catch a show or explore Havana's nightlife before your departure.
